Personal Care is a Medicaid funded program I/DD Medicaid Waiver program is West Virginia's home based on an individual's medical needs. Direct personal care services are provided by individuals or families who meet the basic Specialized Family Care Program requirements. Specialized Family Care falls under the auspices of Person-Centered Support within the Title XIX Medicaid I/DD Waiver Program.
